Dairy cows were very slow and \$20 to \$25 per head lower at the October 2 sale. There were 157 cows and seven stock bulls on sale.

Fresh Holsteins were \$275-375, Guerneys \$150-210, and other breeds \$150-215. Bulls were \$140-175.

The 221 horses, ponies and mules sold slow and barely steady at the September 30 sale. Pony mares brought \$40-110 and geldings \$30-110. Riding horses were \$100-275 and driving horses \$100-275. Killers brought 6 1/2 to 7 cents a pound.

At the Sept 30 sale the 422 hogs sold steady to 25 higher. Retail hogs to local butchers were 18 25 to 19; grades 1 to 3 to packers brought 15 75 to 16 75, and heavyweights were

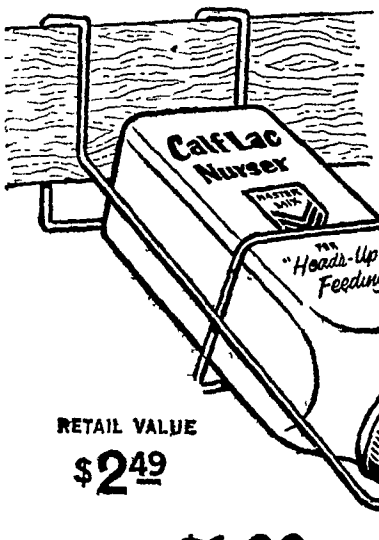
