sional look in garments you're making. Interfacing helps prevent sagging, adds firmness where and when needed, increases life of the garment, reinforces seams, and gives better shape to certain parts of the garment.

Interfacing is usually needed between a part of the garment and its facing, such as yokes, collars, cuffs, closings, and inside skirt waistbands.

Interfacing material should be pliable and never heavier than the fabric it supports.

Types Of Raincoats

Raincoats are of two general types — those that breathe and those that don't.

An all-plastic coat that fits into a pocket is one type of a raincoat that doesn't breathe. It's a completely waterproof type coat, and usually inexpensive. But a raincoat that doesn't breathe has one distinct disadvantage . . . the air can't penetrate the fabric and you'll feel uncomfortably warm after wearing the coat for a while. If you buy this type of coat, be sure there are vents under the arms and the collar.

The water-repellent coat or the coat that breathes is the most popular type. It is made of woven fabric that locks out the wind and rain but allows body vapors to escape from within. These coats are more expensive than the completely waterproof coat of all plastic. Fabric coats come in plaids, solids, and prints and in a wide range of colors. When buying a water repellent coat, read the label for information on its care. The finish may be

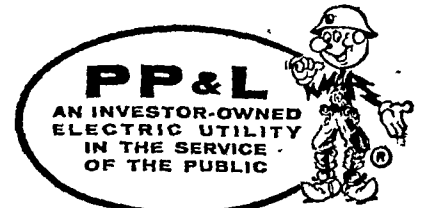

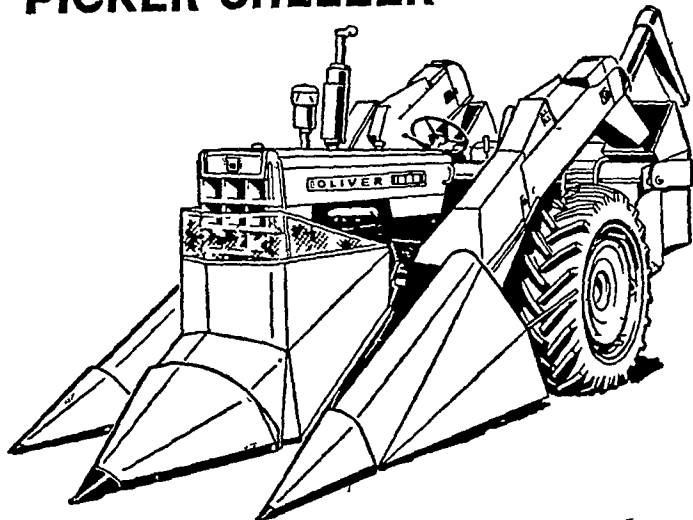
