

# Broilers Go Over 17 Cents

Broiler prices at the Lancaster Poultry Center averaged over 17 cents for the first time since July 5 at the Thursday sale. Only one lot of broilers on offer failed to sell; this at an offered 17.1.

A total of 74,450 broilers in 20 lots changed hands at prices of 17.1 to 17.5 for a sale average of 17.22. The top lot contained 1,000 White Vantress cockerels at nine weeks consigned by Robert Noll and purchased by Marvin Sweigart.

Two lots containing 2,800 Leghorn fowl brought prices of 1 and 83 while one lot of 600 heavy fowl brought 17.2. Three lots totaling 1,950 head of roasters sold for 19 to 21.

The complete October 24 auction offered a total of 94,225 birds in 30 lots and sold 84,225 birds in 26 lots.

## Delmarva Prices Steady; Demand Is Fair

Broiler prices remained relatively steady during the 24 hour period ending 10:30 Friday morning. Demand was fair for moderate auction offerings.

Prices ranged 16.5 to 17.1 for reported purchases of 1,049,900 head at farms during the period. The purchases included 411,900 head sold at Thursday's sale in Selbyville, Del.

With very few plants operating today Eastern Shore processors estimate slaughter for the week end at 696,000 head compared to the 784,000 head last week end.

The Delmarva broiler-feed ratio for the week ending Oct. 18 was up one point from the previous week at 3.1 Broilers averaged 15.97 per pound and mash cost the grower \$101.53 per ton. The ratio for the comparable week a year ago was 3.6 when broilers averaged 16.84 and mash cost the grower \$93.23 per ton.

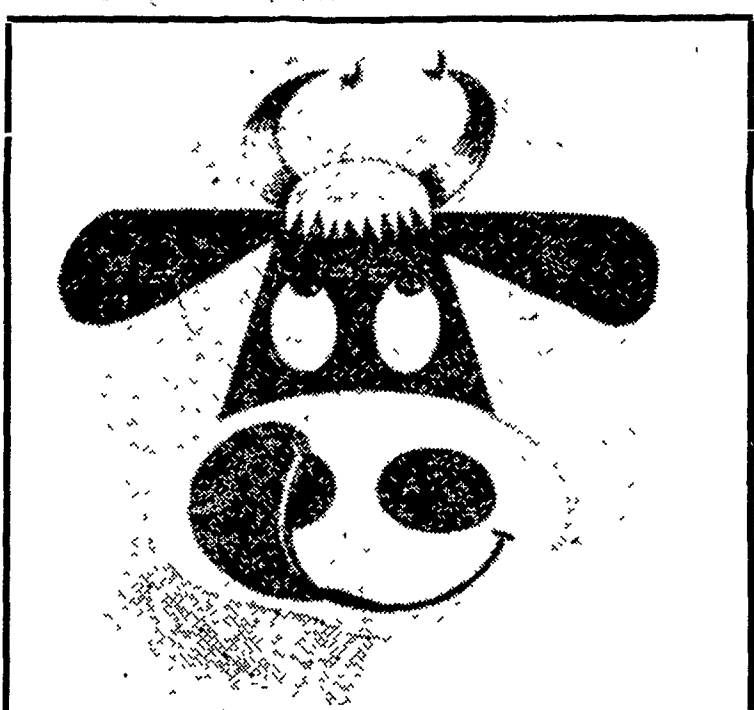
