tractors and equipment to harvest and store the corn.

The first of the seven two-row pickers pulled into the field at about 8 a.m. and the

first yellow ears began to bang the wagon beds. By mid morning, 49 men were on hand to

keep a steady stream of corn flowing up the five elevators and into the crib-

By the time Hershey called the men to knock off for dinner, the pickers were estima-

ting that half the corn was in the crib.

All the cooperation was not in the field. Twenty-six women were on hand to prepare and serve a lunch of meat sandwiches, hot macaroni and cheese, all kinds of salads, relishes,
