Spray Dealers Invited To Meet

Agronomy dealers from six southeastern counties have been invited to attend a meeting next Thursday, November 7, at Hostetter's banquet hall, Mount Joy.

Arnold Lueck, Assistant Lancaster County agent said this week dealers and others interested in crops and pest control from southern Berks, Chester, Dauphin, Lebanon, York, and Lancaster Counties will hear extension specialists from the Pennsylvania State University.

Beginning at 10 a.m. John Baylor will discuss "Perennials to Balance Your Forage Program", Wayne Hinsh will talk about the Agronomy dealer and the Agricultural Conservation Program, George Berggren will speak on weed control in forage crops, and Elmer C Pifer will discuss the new varieties of winter grain.

After lunch the three men will speak again. Berggren will outline the program for control of quack grass, nut grass, and other weeds, Fertilizing potatoes for quality and yield, will be the subject of Pifer, and Hinsh will speak on soil blends and new fertilizer materials. Baylor's topic will be "Managing Sudan - Sorghum Hybrids".
