Start Silage Feeding

Richard S. Adams, extension dairy specialist, suggests dairy men planning to feed grass silage should feed it early if they have a fall freshening herd. He believes amounts of both hay and silage fed should be gradually increased until cows are on full-barn feeding. A gradual change-over keeps stress at a minimum and helps maintain both production and health.

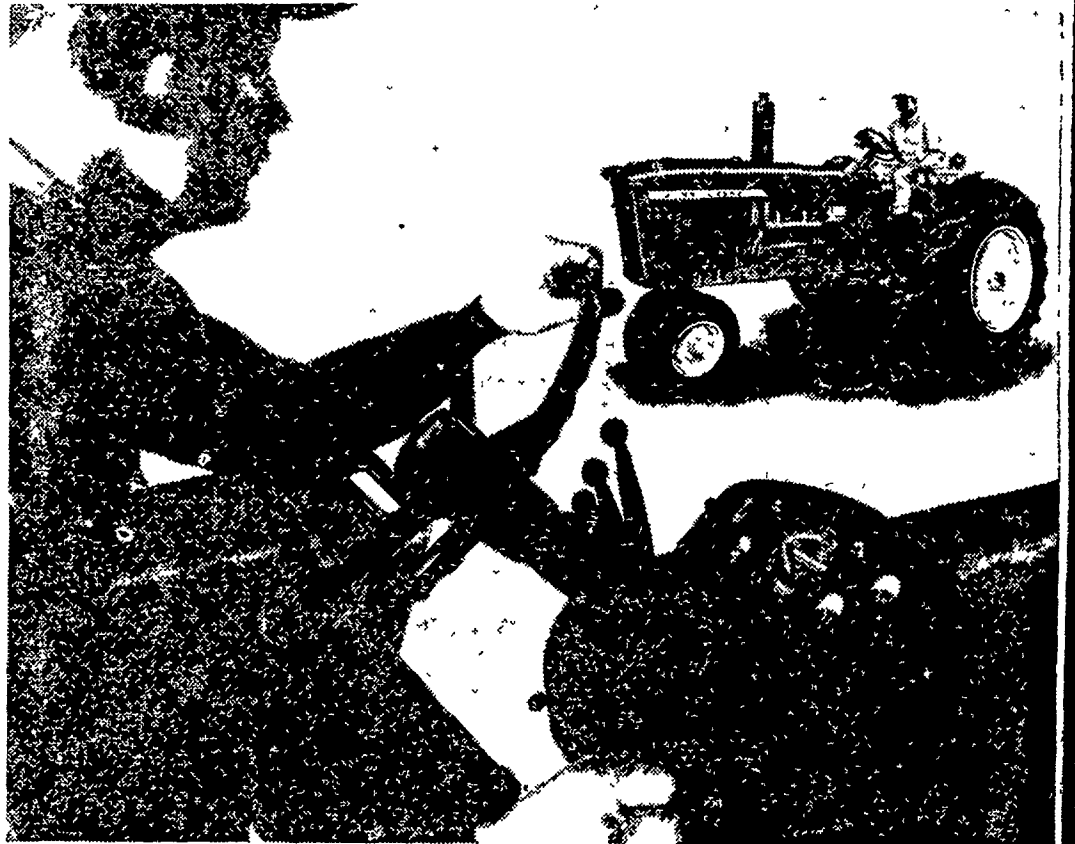

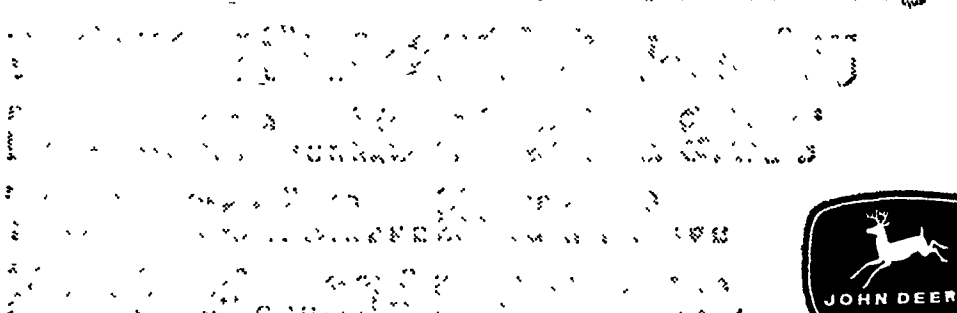
