The 179 dairy cows at the November 6 auction sold about steady. Fresh Holstein cows brought \$275-410, Guernseys \$175-240, and other breeds \$175-270. The eight stock bulls brought \$110-185, and the 18 stock heifers sold at \$65-140

A steady market took the 263 head at the November 4 auction of horses. Riding horses were \$100-200, driving horses \$100-150, and killer horses 6 1/2 to 7 cents a pound. Pony mares brought \$40-90, while gelding ponies sold for \$30-90.

The 423 hogs sold steady to 25 lower at the November 4 auction. Retail hogs to local butchers brought 18 25 to 19 Grades 1 to 3 went to the packers at 16 35 to 16 85, and heavyweight hogs brought 15 25 to 16 25. Sows were 12 50 to 15 The 25 shoats brought \$8 50 to \$10 per head.
