Mrs. Elmer appointed the following committee chairmen for the year: Mrs. Jean Breneisen, program; Mrs. Edith Sher-

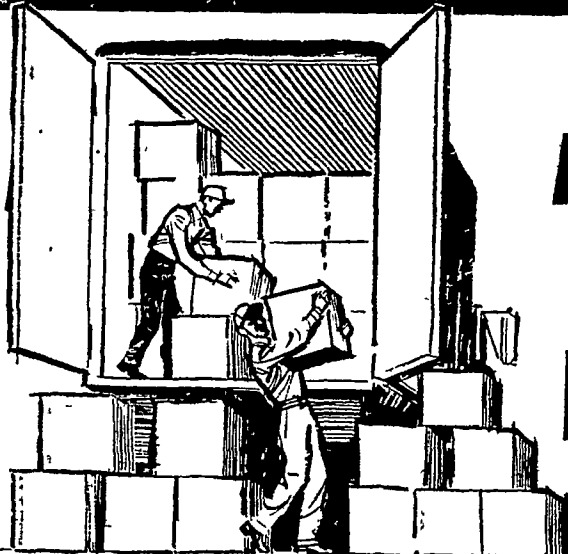
