The termites are at work. Separation of church and state is fine. We believe in that. But divorce of God from state is fatal.

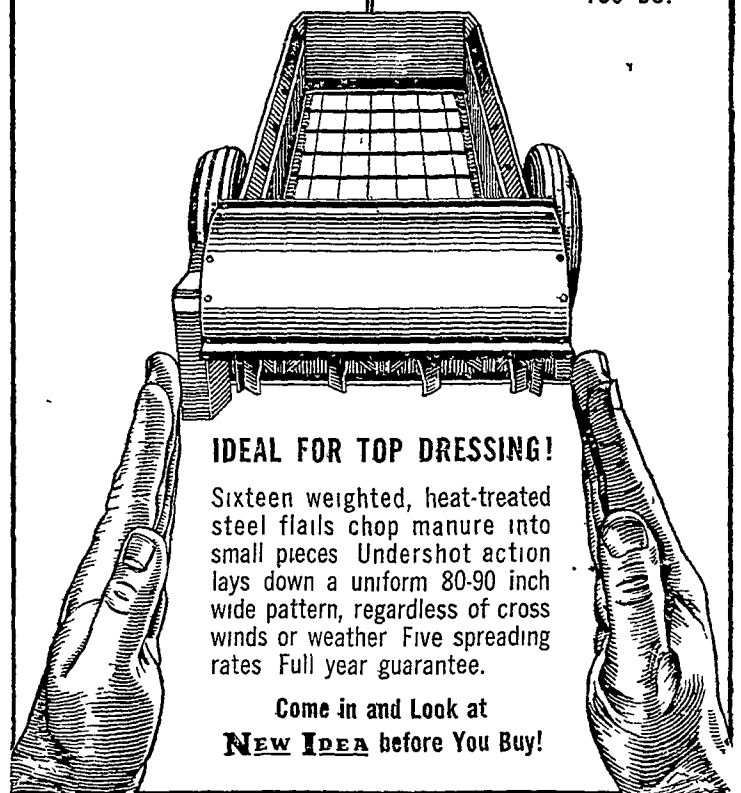
He urged the membership to "encourage prayer and reading of the Bible in our schools."
