herdsman at Lauxmont Farms, Wrightsville for two years and at Robertson Farms, York, for one year before coming to Lancaster County and Stauffer Homestead Farms in 1945.

At the East Earl farm he is in charge of the 85 beef cow herd where he carries on a crossbreeding program with Angus, Brahman and Charolaise cattle. The swine herd consists of 45 to 50 Hampshire sows crossbred with Yorkshire and Landrace boars. Most of the feeder pigs are sold, but some are fed out. Thirty-five Suffolk sheep produce breeding stock and feeder lambs.

Fisher has three workmen besides himself and his two sons, 15 and 16, who work on the farm when not in school. The 365 acre farm has about 175 acres in corn tobacco small grain and hay, and the rest of the ground is pastureland.

On the same date the State Council of Farm Organizations will hold its annual meeting in the Farm Show Building. The December meeting of the Pennsylvania Livestock and Allied Industries Association also will be held that day.

Invitations will be extended to the president of each statewide farmer association and allied organization to attend the event or designate a representative.

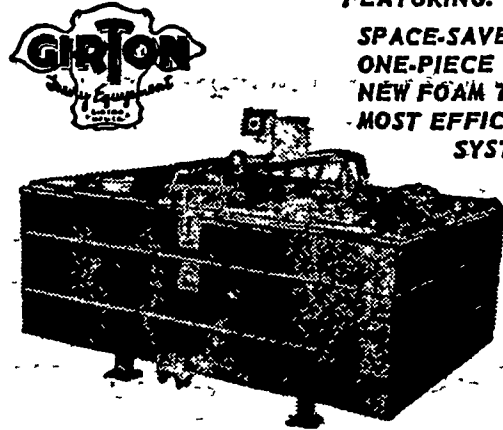

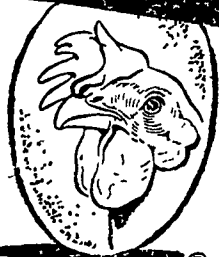
