for you to elect rural representatives to the state legislature", he said. If the state does not have more representatives from rural areas, we are going to see more and more laws passed for the benefit of urban dwellers.
He said he believes we are "jeopardizing the whole agribusiness of the state" because we are not graduating enough good young men with agricultural backgrounds. With all the recent publicity on fewer farms and smaller farm populations, young men on farms are turning to other fields of study.

Turning to other uses of farm lands, Secretary Bull said, "Something is wrong when two or three businessmen can buy a farm, turn it into a pitch and putt golf course, ski lodge or fee-fishing ponds and borrow three times as much money on it as a farmer can borrow on the same farm." If a farmer turns his farm to that kind of use, he asked, is he still a farmer?
He pointed to the high capital investment needed in today's agriculture. "If we take the total farm investment and multiply it by six per cent we

get the total farm income in the United States. This is not a particularly happy situation," he said. He suggested that Young Farmers might be as well off financially to sell out, invest the money at six per cent, and retire in Florida.

Bull called for more research in marketing to keep our foreign markets and compete with foreign products coming into the United States. "Europe is looking at American Markets. They are upgrading their sanitary standards and will be competing with locally produced food products. We are going to have to market our products out of the country, and we must do more research to keep our markets"

He said his department recently learned that a majority of the institutions in the state use frozen eggs put up in 10 pound bags, but one processor in the state puts up such a product. Several processors are now looking at the possibility of marketing such a package.

He called on the Young Farmers to encourage such research to boost the sale of Pennsylvania products.

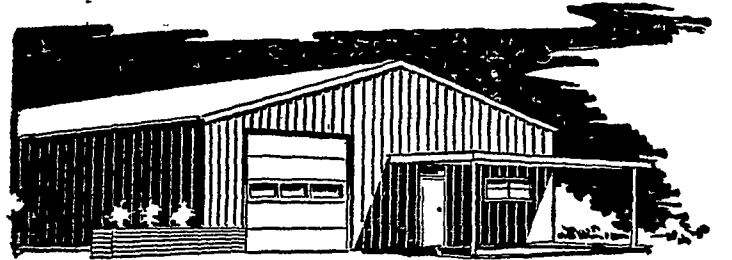

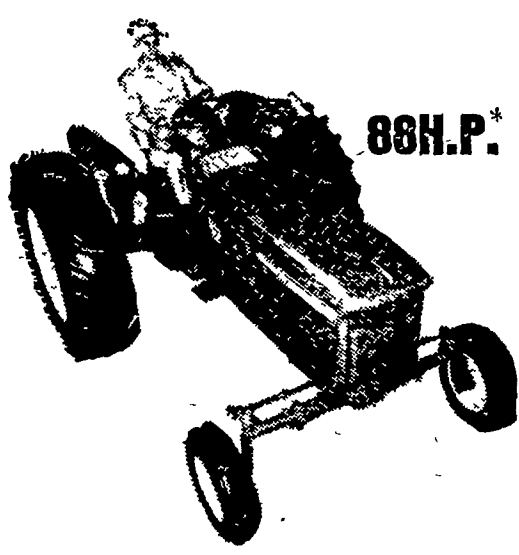

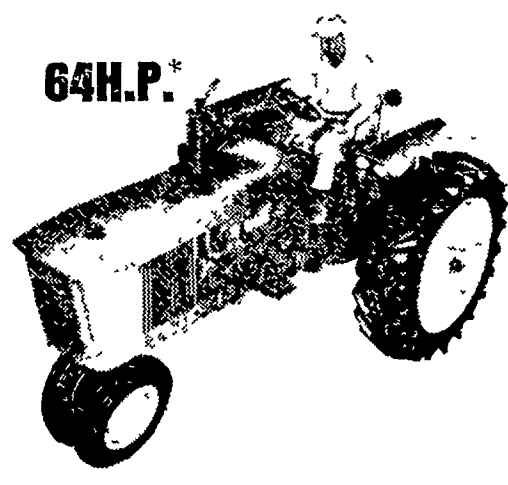
