

All Broilers Are Sold

Live broiler prices this week at the Lancaster Poultry Center were down almost 1½ cents a pound from the previous week, but all birds on offer were sold.

Ten lots of broilers including 74,000 birds changed hands at prices of 14.7 to 15.2 for a sale average of 14.87. Last week's average was 16.24.

One lot of 925 roasters, consigned by Robert Noll was purchased by College Hill Poultry for 22.1. A lot of 1,400 pullets brought 19.1. Three lots including 3,450 leghorn fowl brought 7.9 to 8.9, and 1,275 heavy fowl in two lots sold for 15.0.

The complete November 21 auction offered and sold a total of 81,170 birds in 18 lots. Following is the complete sale report with lot number, seller, grower in parenthesis, amount and breed, age in weeks and days, buyer and price.

Demand Is Good, Offerings Light

Live broiler prices advanced nearly three quarters of a cent during the 24 hour period ending 10:30 Friday morning. Delmarva reported prices of 13.7 to 15.5 at farms for 892,100 head purchased during the period. The purchases included 308,000 head sold at Thursday's auction in Selbyville, Del.

Demand was good for light auction offerings. Estimated slaughter by Eastern Shore processors for the week end was 454,000 head compared to the 583,000 head last week end.

The Delmarva broiler-feed ratio for the week ending November 15 was steady with the previous week at 3.3. Broilers during the week averaged 16.60 per pound and mash cost the grower \$99.34 per ton.

The ratio for the comparable week a year ago was 2.8 when broilers averaged 13.27 and mash cost the grower \$95.23 per ton.

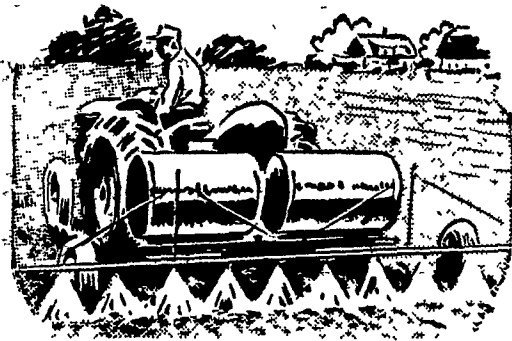
