

Three Countians Are Elected By Prod. Credit

Two county farmers last week were re-elected and one was elected for the first time to the board of directors of the Lancaster Production Credit Association and the Federal Land Bank Association.

Ballots cast at three meetings of the two associations re-elected Richard B. Lefever,

Quarryville R1, to the board of PCA, and J. Homer Graybill, Mannheim R3, to directorship of FLB. Serving his first term on the board of the Federal Land Bank will be Elvin Hess, Jr, Strasburg R1. The other PCA director elected was Samuel Williams, Middletown.

Approximately 165 members and guests attended the annual meeting in the Lampeter-Strasburg High School, 130 at the Annville High School, and 110 at the Elizabethtown High School.

Paul B. Whipple, Lancaster, in his Manager's report at all three meetings, noted Production Credit Assoc. loans exceeded \$5,400,000. outstanding, the most in the history of the Assoc This is over \$1,300,000 above last year at this time, brought about by rapid changes and increases necessary in agricultural changes, new buildings etc.
