(Continued from Page 1) championship. Frey's heavy-weight champion was followed in the placings by the entry of Mary Jane Herr, Refton.

Mae Mast, Elverson R2, had the top Hereford in light-weight judging followed by Michael Longenecker, Lititz R2. Wesley Mast also had the reserve champion Hereford, which took the top spot in Middleweight class.

At the Thursday sale of show steers, Frey's 1,095 lb. champion sold to Heinz Riverside Abattoir, Inc., Baltimore for 75 cents a pound and a total of \$824.25. The Mast Hereford sold for 50 cents a pound.

The top steer of the show sold to Schluderberg and Kurdle, Baltimore for \$2.06 per pound and returned \$2,296.90 to the Brown sisters.

Frey also showed the reserve champion in the steer carcass classes on Wednesday. The 980 pound angus finished ninth in the on-foot classes last Saturday. The carcass hung at 645 pounds for a 64.2 dressing percentage and graded choice.

County showmen continued their winning ways into the county group competition. Five county 4-H steers won the 12th championship in 13 years at the show. The Angus entries were shown by Mae Mast, John Frey, Mary Jane Herr, and following are the county Jay Bixler, Marietta R1. The

Hereford group finished in 7th place.

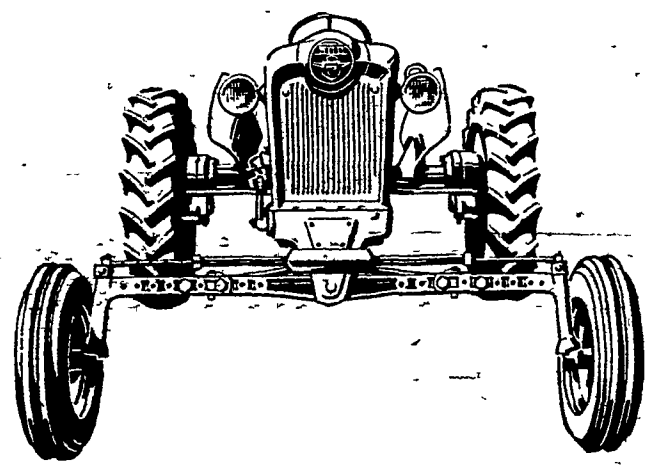
