of it boned horse meat, that were confiscated by state agents last week at an unlicensed Factoryville, RD 2, packing plant was still unknown today. Meanwhile, the meat has been removed to a Scranton cold storage pending final disposition.

The State Department of Agriculture, aided by the Pennsylvania State Police, on the night of Nov. 12 forcibly entered the Factoryville plant following refusal of admission to department agents for routine inspection. No personnel was on the premises at the time.

On an earlier visit to the plant State Department of Agriculture agents said they were barred by William Lance, a former owner and operator of the plant, who on another occasion had been involved in illegal sale of horse meat for human consumption.

Meanwhile, state agents said a check on ownership of the premises showed that the title has changed hands at least twice just recently.



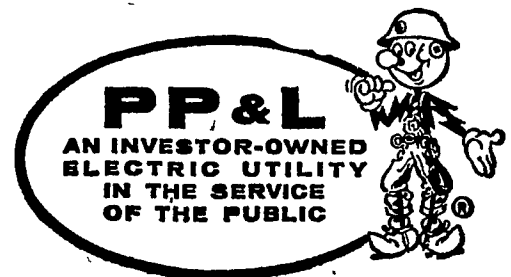
