Agricultural Marketing Service officials said the new order will extend to the previously unregulated New Jersey territory the same system for pay-

used under both the Philadelphia and Wilmington orders. Each individual handler will pay a uniform price to producers from whom he buys his milk, based on how the milk is used.

The new, single order is patterned after the Philadelphia order, with several provisions added to:

1. Fully regulate any plant supplying milk in any amount to the Delaware Valley market for fluid use.

2. Account separately for skim milk and buttermilk at individual plants, and classify and price closing inventory as reserve milk, instead of bottling milk.

3. Allow unlimited directions of milk between regulated plants operated by the same handler.

4. Substitute the U.S. manufacturing plant price series for the Midwestern condensery price series in the bottling milk pricing formula, and limit the bottling milk pricing provisions to the period ending June 30, 1965.

5. Compute and announce
