## New Holland Auction

**Thursday, Nov. 28**  
 Because of the Thanksgiving holiday, no report was available from the U.S. Market News Service.  
**CATTLE:** 637, Supply included 30 percent cows and heifers.  
 New Holland reported Slaughter Steers weighing 1,150 pounds down were steady to 50 lower. Steers weighing over 1,150 pounds were 50 to 1.00 lower. Feeders were 1.00 lower. Cows and heifers were 1.00 higher.  
 High choice and prime grade slaughter steers 950-1,250 lbs., 24-25.50. Choice grade 1,300 to 1,600 pounds 21-22.50. Good and low choice 900 to 1,200 pounds 22-23.50. Standards all weights 18-21.  
 Cows: Cutter and utility 14.50-16. Canner and low cutter 13-14.50, shelly canner down to 11.  
 Heifers: Good grade 19-21, standard 17-19, cutter heifers 15-17  
 Feeders: A lot of 12 good and choice feeders at 753 pounds 21.75. Medium kinds 600-800 pounds 19-21, and common at the same weight 16.50-19.  
 Calves: 169, vealers 1.00 to 2.00 higher Choice and prime 35-39, good and low choice 30-35, standard 25-30, common and utility 18-25.  
 Dairy cattle sold slow and barely steady at the November 27 auction. The 204 cows, seven bulls and 20 heifers changed hands at the pre-hol-

iday sale. Fresh Holstein cows brought \$275-450; Guernseys \$150-250, and other breeds \$150-300. Stock bulls brought \$125-200, and stock heifers sold for \$75-145.

The 154 horses at the November 25 auction sold slow and lower. Riding horses brought \$100-240; driving horses were \$100-150; and killers brought 5 to 6 cents a pound. Pony mares were \$40-70, and geldings \$30-80.

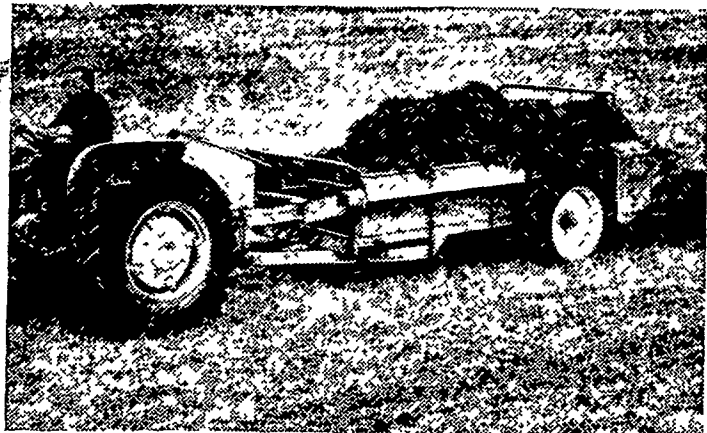
A total of 311 market hogs sold at steady prices on the November 25 auction. Retail hogs to local butchers brought 18 to 18.50 while 1 to 3 grades went to packers at 16.10 to 16.75. Heavyweight hogs brought 15.25 to 16.25, and sows were 11.50 to 13.50.

The 81 calves at the November 25 sale sold 2.00 higher. Choice and prime vealers were 34-37, good and low choice 32-34, standard 28-32, and cull and common 15.25.

### Sow Flower Seeds

Sow larkspur, cornflower, coreopsis and snapdragon in the garden where they are to mature, if the ground is not frozen. A. O. Rasmussen, Penna State extension ornamental horticulturist, says by sowing in the fall the flowers start into growth much earlier in the spring, even though they may lie dormant over winter.
