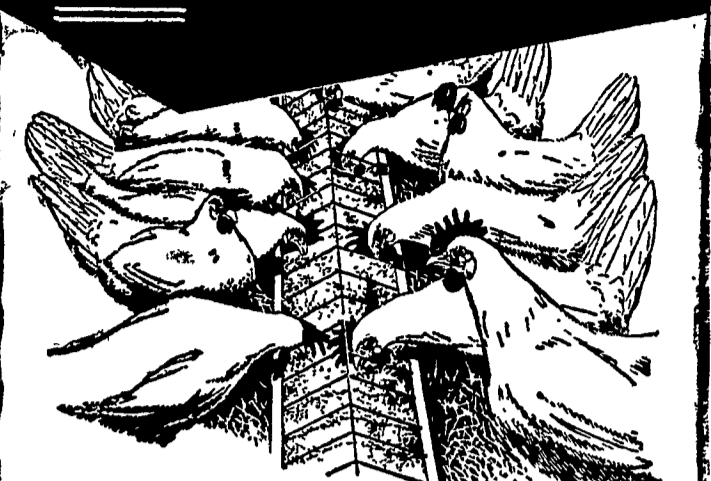
Lampeter FFA Elects Officers

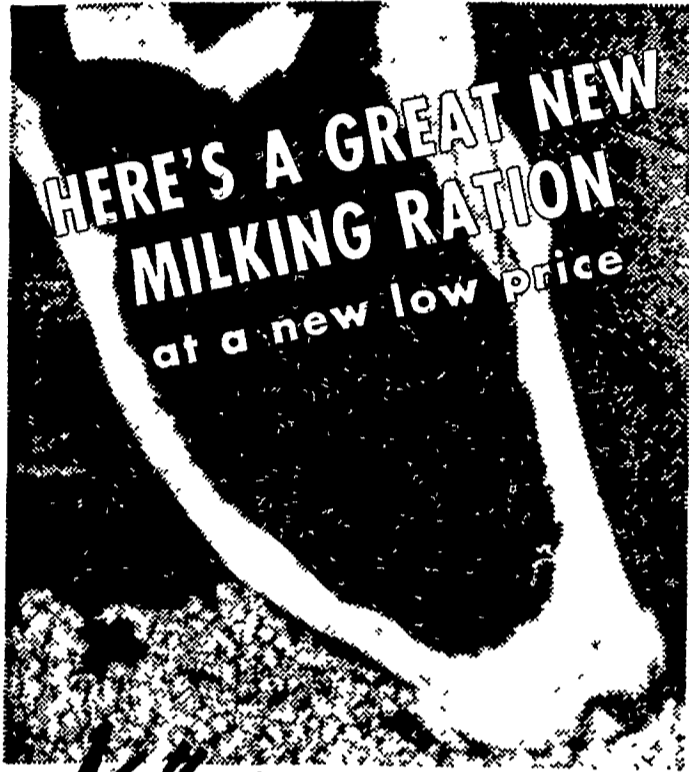
