county's top contender for farm show honors. He has won the state Farm Show championship six times previously.

Trimble plowed down 11 tons of manure on a legume-grass sod, disced the field twice and harrowed and cul-packed once. He planted his hybrid corn on May 7 nine inches apart on 42 inch rows. He plowed down 100 pounds of 15-10-10 and added 250 pounds of 5-10-10 in the row at planting time.

Weeds were controlled with 2-4-D and one cultivation. His yield on the acre was 132 5 bushels.

Judge John Harris, Assistant Dauphin County Agent, put the reserve championship on the 10 ear exhibit of Annette Long, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Melvin Long, Lititz R3.

Miss Long had the high project score in the contest with 97 out of a possible 100 points. Gary Porter, Washington Boro R1, had 95.9 points, and Jay Richard Bucher, Ephrata R1, scored 92.6. Trimble's overall project score was fourth at 90.9.

Two-thirds of all shirts bought are sport shirts, and short-sleeved dress shirts may be a current compromise.


