

Broilers Bounce Back

Broilers began to come back somewhat from the two past sales at the Lancaster Poultry Center. The January 2 auction sold 27,650 head in eight lots at prices ranging 15 2 to 16 5 for a sale average of 15.59. All broilers on offer were sold.

Two lots including 1,240 heavy fowl brought 17.8, and 10,400 head of leghorn fowl in three lots brought 8 2 to 8 6.

The complete sale offered 40,360 head in 14 lots and sold 39,410 birds in 13 lots.

with retail hogs going to local butchers at 17 to 17.50. Heavyweight hogs brought 14.75 to 15 25 and sows were 9.50 to 14.

The 155 calves sold 1.00 to 1.50 higher at the December 30 auction. Choice and prime vealers brought 35-38 50, good and low choice 33-35, standard 30-33, and cull and common 18-25.

Old sheep were \$4 to \$8 and lambs brought 18-23.

Broilers Gain A Half Cent

Live broiler prices advanced nearly a half cent during the 24 hour period ending 10 30 Friday morning. Delmarva reported prices of 13 1 to 14 8 for 1,113,500 at farms including 426,500 head sold at Thursday's auction in Selbyville, Del. Largest percentage of the sales were from 14 0 to 14 4.

Demand during the period was good for the moderate auction offerings. Ready to cook demand was spotty ranging fair to good with several plants operating today. Estimated slaughter by eastern shore processors for the week end was 903,000 head compared to the 880,000 head last week end.

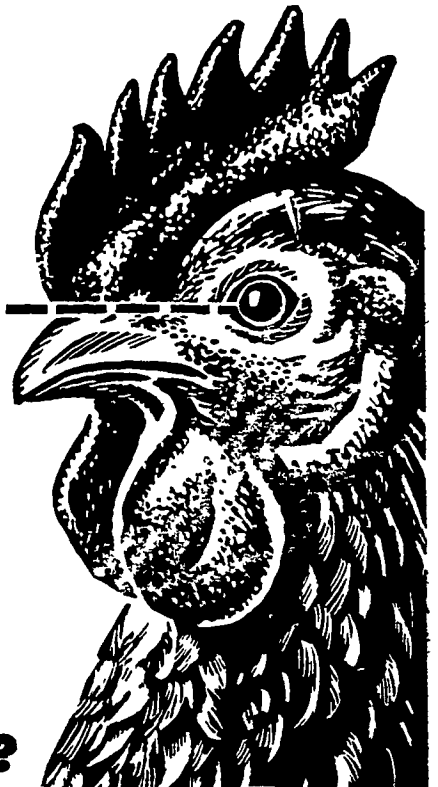
