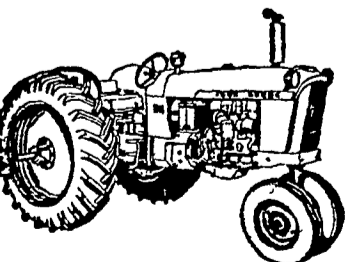
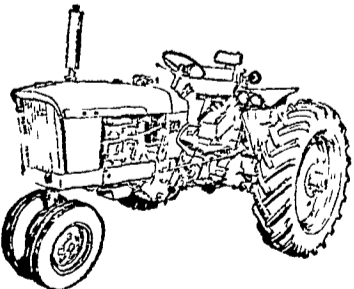

He served his local chapter as chaplain last year farming program includes sows, 20 fattening hogs, one acre of corn.

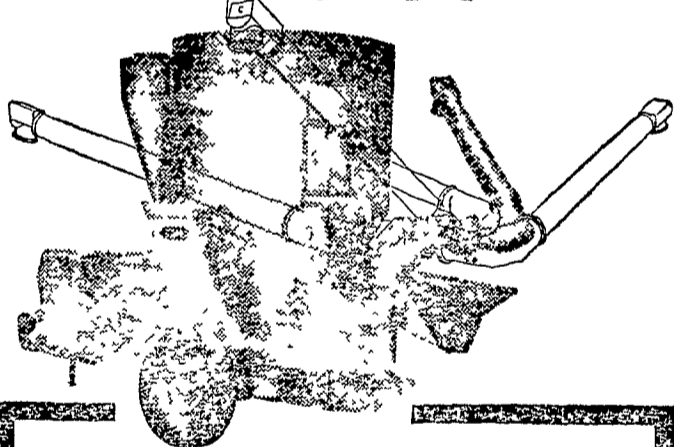
DONALD S. MILLER

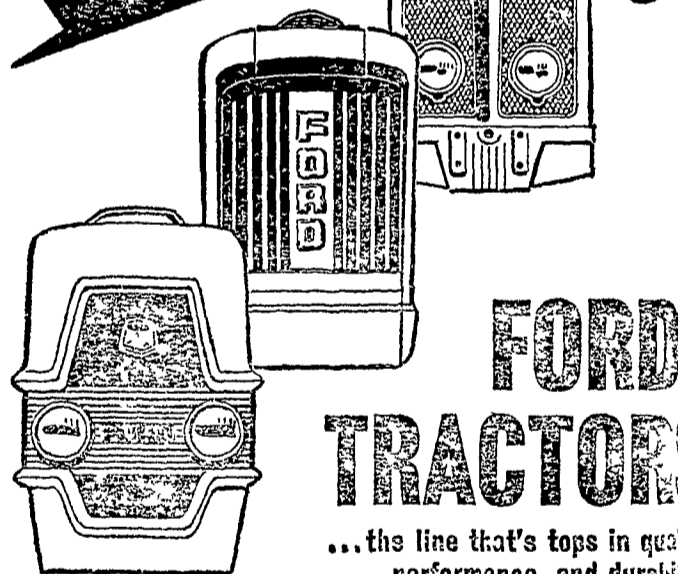
