

Broiler Auction Closes

The final auction at the Lancaster Poultry Center saw 16,000 broilers in three lots sold at prices ranging from 15.3 to 15.5 for a sale average of 15.4.

At the January 30 auction one lot of pullets including 250 head brought 23.1, while a lot of 175 cockerels sold for 20.0. Six lots including 8,000 heavy fowl brought 17.25 to 19 while 375 males sold with them at 8.3 to 8.8. A lot of 23.1 capons brought 23.1.

Prices Steady; Demand Is Fair

Live broiler prices in Delmarva continued about steady during the 24 hour period ending 10:30 Friday morning. Demand was fair

Delmarva reported at-farm prices of 14.5 to 15.6 for 886, 800 head during the period including 429,800 head offered and sold at Thursday's auction at Selbyville, Del.

Estimated slaughter by eastern shore processors was 778,000 head compared to the 156,000 head last week end

The Delmarva broiler-feed ratio for the week ending January 24 was down one point to 3.1 as broilers averaged 15.72 per pound and mash cost the grower \$100.69 per ton.

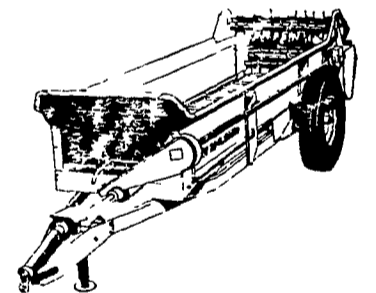

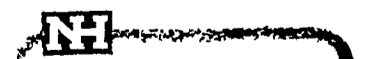

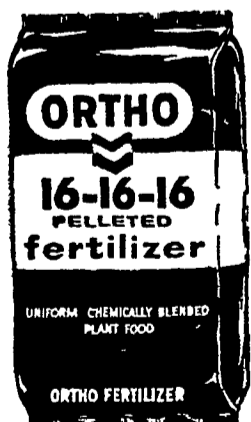
