## Feed Dealers Call For Lower Freight Rates

Speaking on behalf of the Pennsylvania Millers' and Feed Dealers' Association, a statewide organization composed primarily of independently-owned feed and flour mills, Donald W. Parke, Executive Secretary of that organization, appealed to the rail carriers of the East at a public hearing held in Chicago, Ill. January 30, to lower their freight rates on grain and grain products.

The hearing was held by the Traffic Executive Association - Eastern Railroads, the organization which represents the railroads of the East.

In his testimony Parke pointed out that Pennsylvania is a substantially coindustrial state and its dependence upon the Midwest for corn and other grain is likely to become greater due to urban sprawl industrialization and government programs.

## Hog Slaughter Sets Records

HARRISBURG — Pennsylvania's booming meat business set another record in 1963 with 3,225,000 hogs slaughtered . . . the first time in the Commonwealth's history the total topped the three-million mark.

Slaughter showed an increase of 332,000 hogs, or 11 per cent, over the previous high recorded in 1962, according to the Pennsylvania Crop Reporting Service.

Cattle slaughter in 1963 was up also reaching a total of 900,500 head compared to 897,000 head in the previous year.

The increases were in line with the national trend that saw red meat production in 1963 rise 6 per cent over the previous year, the PCRS said. U. S. production last year totaled 29,521 million pounds. Beef accounted for 16,050 million pounds up 7 per cent. Pork, at 11,865 million pounds, was up 6 per cent.

Calf, sheep and lamb slaughter was down in both the nation and the state. Pennsylvania reported 667,000 calves slaughtered, compared to 717,000 the year before. Sheep and lamb slaughter slumped to 248,200 head compared to 376,500 in 1962.
