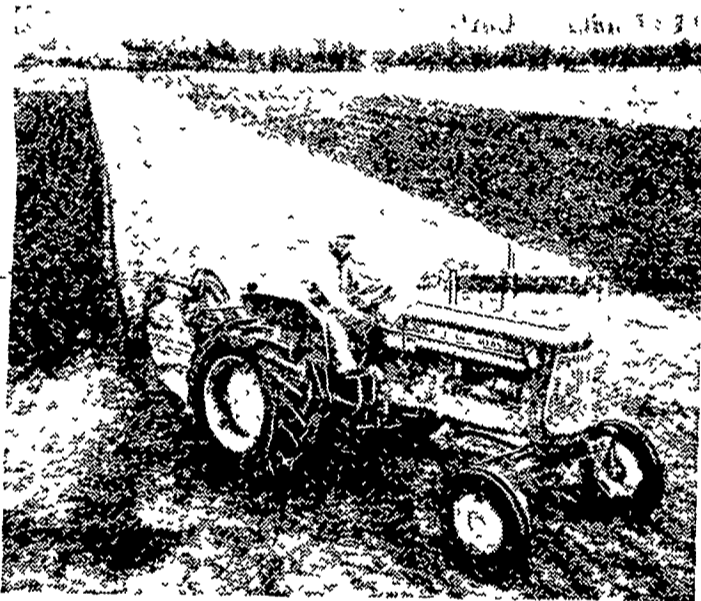
The 110 cows and 10 heifers sold at steady prices at the Feb 5 auction of dairy cows Fresh Holstein cows brought \$275-375, Guernseys \$150-270, and other breeds \$170-275.

Killer horses were strong to higher and all other kinds were fully steady as 253 head crossed the block at the Feb 3 auction. Riding horses brought \$100-225, and driving horses were \$110-165. Mules brought \$300-640 by the pair and \$125-260 single Drest horses sold for \$275-475 by the pair and \$130-215 singly. Pony mares were \$40-85 and geldings were \$30-85 Killers brought 6 to 6 1/2 cents a pound.

Hog receipts totaled 417 head of market hogs and 25 shoats at the Feb 3 sale Hogs sold steady to 25 higher.

Retail hogs to local butchers brought 17 25 to 17 75 while grades 1 to 3 went to packers at 16 to 16 60 Heavy-weight hogs brought 15 25 to 15 75 Shoats sold for \$9 to \$11 50 per head

The 130 calves sold 1 00 to 2 00 higher at the Feb 3 auction Choice and prime vealers sold for 36-42, good and low choice 34-36, standard 30-34, and cull and common 15-25.
