FHA Loans \$6.2 Million To Farmers

The U. S. Department of Ag-
riculture's Farmers Home Ad-
ministration made or insured
\$6.2 million in loans to Penn-
sylvania farm and other rural
families, during 1963. Raymond
J. Kerstetter, state director of
the agency announced in Har-
risburg today.

A total of 1,227 Pennsylvania
families used one or more of
the agency's loan programs
during the year. This represen-
ted a rise of 7 percent over the
number for 1962.

Payments of principal and
interest on Farmers Home Ad-
ministration loans by borrow-
ers in Pennsylvania during the
year totaled \$5,836,871. This
was a 7 percent increase over
the amount repaid in 1962.

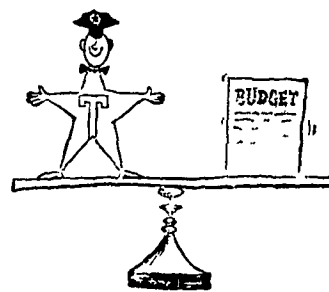
Kerstetter reported that in
1963 Farmers Home Adminis-
tration supervised loan pro-
grams had two major results
of importance to the economy
of the state.

"Loans to family farmers en-
abled them to make a major
contribution to the well being
and progress of the state's ag-
riculture during 1963," he
said.

"Capital and management
assistance supplied by Farmers
Home Administration to its
borrowers helped them develop
and enlarge their farms, oper-
ate more efficiently, and build
a sound farming business.

A total of \$2,406,695 went
to 603 Pennsylvania farmers
to pay for equipment, feed
seed livestock, for other farm
and home operating needs and
to refinance chattel debts
carry out forestry purposes
and develop income-producing
recreational enterprises.

Farm ownership loans total-
ing about \$1,799,972 were used
by 151 farmers to enlarge, de-
velop, and buy farms not lar-
ger than family size, and to
refinance debts, carry out for-
estry purposes and develop in-
come-producing recreation en-
terprises.
