In a report issued by the Lancaster Livestock Exchange Wednesday showed a total dollar volume of \$44,059,049 at the local terminal market

Compared to the \$55,059, 578 in 1962, the current year's volume was down some \$11, 000.529

One of the major contributing factor's, according to exchange officials, was a smaller feeder steer volume resulting from shortages of feed in the second year of drought condi-

Lower fat cattle pinces, as well as feeder steers and hogs also contributed to the decline

Along with the dollar volume decline the exchange reported a fire cent drop in re-
