

Swine Clinics Start Next Week

A series of three swine clinics, sponsored by the Cooperative Extension Service, will be held March 11, 18 and 25 in the Farm Bureau Building, Dillerville Rd., Northwestern edge of Lancaster.

County Agent M M Smith announces the three clinics, designed to cover all phases of modern-day swine production, including feeding, selection, buildings equipment health, costs and returns will be held at weekly intervals with each clinic scheduled to start promptly at 7:30 p.m.

Specialists in livestock, agricultural engineering, and veterinary medicine from The Pennsylvania State University, will serve as instructors.

At the first meeting March 11, talks will be given by Dr. William Adams extension veterinarian, and Dwight Younkin, extension animal husbandry specialist. Speakers at the second meeting March 18 will be Lester Burdette, extension animal husbandry specialist, and Axel Carlson, extension agricultural engineer. Appearing at the final clinic on March 25 will be Larry Gobble, associate professor of animal industry, and Grant Sherritt, as-

sistant professor of animal industry.

Smith urges all those interested in swine breeding, feeding, and management, to attend the clinics. Admission is free.

Annual Hog Sale Is March 17

Hog feeders from Lancaster, York, Lebanon, Snyder and Dauphin Counties will come to Lancaster, Tuesday, March 17th, for the annual Lancaster County Swine Producers Association Market Hog Show & Sale.

The show will be held in the small animal barn at the Stock Yards, Tuesday morning commencing at 8:30 a.m. Lester Burdette and Dwight Younkin, hog specialists from Penna. State University will be the judges.

The auction of these prize hogs will take place in the afternoon at 2:00 p.m. Wilbur Hosler will call the sale.

There will be a carcass evaluation on foot, Monday, March 16th at 3:00 p.m. Hogs entered for evaluation and possible litter certification will be slaughtered by Kunzler Co., Tuesday and be evaluated on the rail Wednesday afternoon at the plant.

Entries may be filed with Earl Fisher, East Earl Rd. 1 or James Z. Martin, Christiana, R2.

Judging will be in two weight classes, 190-220 lbs., 221-250 lbs., in singles, pens of three and truckloads according to breed of the sire.

Extension Ass'n Reorganizes



The committee voted to employ a part-time summer assistant home economist as in 1964.


