### Freight Rates To Farmers To Be Lowered

HARRESBURG — Farmers in Pennsylvania may soon get the economic advantages of reduced freight rates on feed grains and soy meal, State Secretary of Agriculture L. H. Bull said here today.

Railroad officials have indicated that reductions in rates definitely will be made on feed grains shipped into the Northeast but they were doubtful if these would be as substantial as the reductions put into effect some time ago on shipments of feed grains into the South and Southeast.

In the competitive markets for farm products, Northeastern producers have been at a disadvantage in competing against producers who enjoy the lower freight rates This is especially time in the poultry and live stock industries where grains are a heavy cost item in production

Producers, processors and feed dealers have been working in harmony with the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture, Secretary Bull said, in seeking a solution to the transportation cost problem.
