

Weekly Broiler Report

Hatcherymen in the Keystone State set 1,237,000 eggs for broiler production during the week, according to the Pennsylvania Crop Reporting Service. The set was up 2 percent from the previous week and 4 percent above a year ago.

Placement of broiler chicks during the week totaled 906,000 — the same as a week earlier but 21 percent above a year ago.

Inshipments of broiler-type chicks for the past 10 weeks totaling 406,000 were the same as a year ago. Outshipments of 1,740,000 were down 9 percent.

Broiler chicks placed in the 22 major producing states were up 3 percent from a week earlier and 9 percent above a year ago. Eggs set were the same as the previous week but 1 percent above a year earlier.

Offerings of heavy type hens limited but adequate for a fair demand. Some lot of heavy type 5-6# size purchased from New England.

Light type, hens offerings sufficient for a fair demand. Prices paid at farms for heavy type hens 15-19¢, light type hens 7-9¢ mostly 8-8½¢.

Prices Decline; Demand Fair

Live broiler prices declined slightly during the 24 hour period ending 10 30 Friday morning

Demand was fair for the moderate auction offerings. Ready to cook demand was sluggish and unaggressive with only limited interest in delivery next week. Practically no Eastern Shore processing plants planned operation today. Processors noted resistance to higher dressed prices ranging up to a half cent.

Estimated slaughter for the week end by eastern shore processors was 630,000 head compared to the 942,000 head last week end.

Prices at farms ranged 14.7 to 16.6 on 1,019,200 head reported purchased during the period. Prices include 494,600 head purchased of 504,100 head offered at Thursday's auction in Selbyville, Del. Nearly 40 per cent of the auction sales were between 16 0 and 16 4.

The Delmarva broiler-feed ratio for the week ending March 6 was up one point from the previous week at 3 0. Broilers during the week averaged 15.17 per pound and mash cost the grower \$100.17 per ton. The ratio for the comparable week a year ago was 3.4 when broilers averaged 16.97 and mash cost \$99 03.

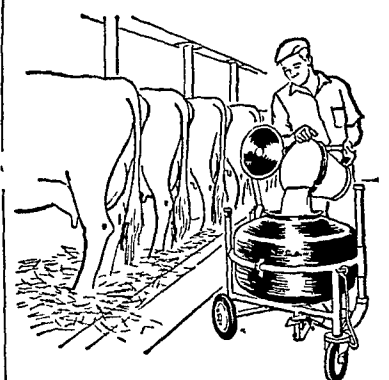
