## Inspection For Greenhouse Men Is Planned

HARRISBURG — The State Department of Agriculture today announced expansion of its nursery inspection and certification program to provide the same service to greenhouse operators in Pennsylvania.

State Agriculture Secretary Leland H. Bull said the step is planned to help Pennsylvania greenhouse operators achieve maximum production of quality materials so necessary today in this highly competitive business.

Operators of commercial greenhouses have been invited by Henry F. Nixon, director of the department's Bureau of Plant Industry, to "become acquainted with and take advantage of these services."

Essentially, the program is designed to help reduce insect and disease problems in the greenhouse industry, Nixon said. The ultimate goal, he explained, is certification of "all woody florist stock, their roots, cuttings, grafts and scions; herbaceous perennials and other plants and plant products, as well as finished stock, other than cut flowers."

Resident nursery dealers are required, Nixon explained, to handle stock from certified sources as provided in the Plant Act of 1937. In the past, he added, the bulk of the effort has been devoted to outdoor nurseries growing ornamental plants used for landscape purposes.

## Farm Products Must Be Labeled

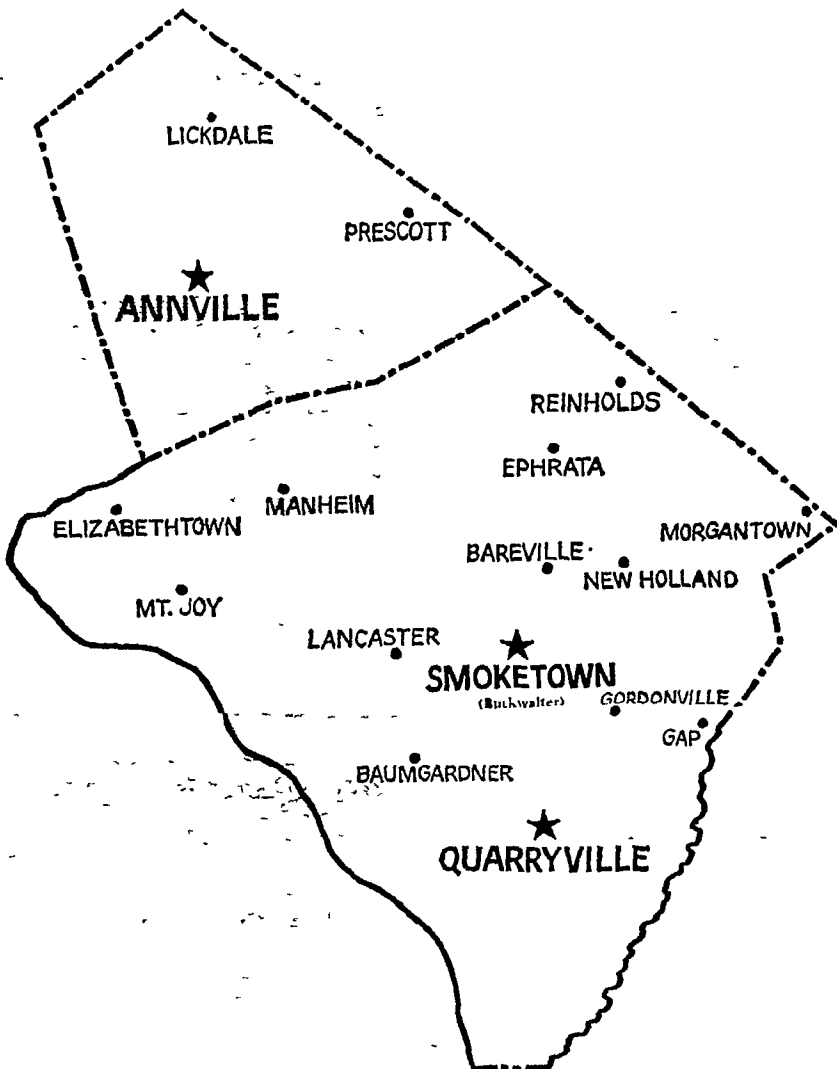
HARRISBURG — Receipt of reports that an unlabeled product is being peddled in the state as "maple syrup" brought a reminder today by the State Department of Agriculture that all packaged foods must be labeled.

Labels that name the product, designate the net contents, and give the name and address of the producer or distributor are required by Pennsylvania law on all foodstuffs sold in packages or containers, according to Delmar K. Myers, director of the department's Bureau of Foods and Chemistry.

Myers said this requirement is a service to consumers. He urged them, for their own protection, to purchase only properly labeled goods. Lack of patronage, he added, "is the most effective way for stopping illegal sales practices."

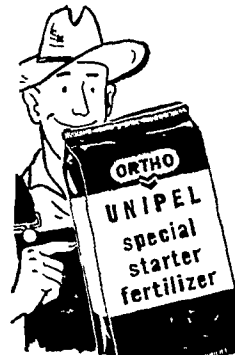
