poultry disease information from Dr. Robert Gentry of the Poultry Disease Laboratory at Pennsylvania State University. Programs that effect disease control will be discussed along with the specific diseases of leucosis and current developments in C R D. control. Effects of isolation practices in relation to leucosis control will be specifically discussed as well as hopes for the future in the general disease picture.

The program will also feature Dr John Shutze, a recent addition to the Pennsylvania Poultry Extension Staff from Washington State. Dr. Shutze will cover lighting, a subject on which he has done considerable research. He will discuss various types of lighting systems in use today and give principles which should be followed in order to effectively use various types of housing in existence today.
