

### Traditional Easter Fare Featured

Ham, turkey, and eggs will be the price leaders this week for holiday food shoppers. You'll find Easter hams costing a few cents less in some stores to a few cents more in others compared to a year ago. Prices will vary between stores and in stores because of the different kinds, cuts, and styles of ham. Heavier supplies and more variety of fresh produce are appearing in area stores but many items continue to wear high price tags.

#### Kinds And Styles Of Ham

Ham will be getting most of the attention at meat counters this week. As you look over the styles of ham you'll find cooked and uncooked, bone-in, skinless, shankless, semi-boneless, boneless-skinless, and canned ham. To further expand your choice, hams may be offered whole, as halves that contain the center slices or cut into portion or ends or thirds in which the center slices have been removed.

#### Don't Buy Ham By Price Alone

When buying ham, read the label and don't make your selection solely on the price. Ham prices will vary because of the cut, weight, amount of trimming, cooking, and packaging. A heavy ham costs less per pound than a small one and shanks or butts cut from heavy hams will cost less than those cut from light ones. A fully-cooked ham costs more per pound than a regular smoked ham. So, read the label and don't buy ham by price alone.

#### Easter Egg Time

Eggs are in the spotlight this week and you'll find unusually large displays. Prices are unchanged to as much as four cents lower than a week ago. This week all sizes represent an equal value on a cost per pound basis. Remember, shell color makes no difference as to nutritive value or quality of eggs. For Easter egg coloring you may prefer white shells for pastel colors and brown

shells for darker shades. **Produce Values For Easter Menus**

If you're planning a big Easter dinner you'll find many low prices on corn, asparagus, lettuce, tomatoes, strawberries, apples, and bananas. Good buys will be noted on endive, escarole, carrots, medium-sized yellow onions, and radishes.

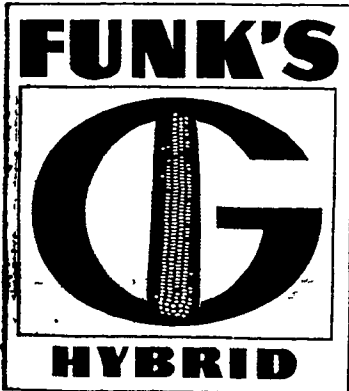

Mrs. Earl Diehm introduced Rev. Charles E. Wondeley, Administrator of the Lancaster County Home, who spoke on the operation of the home.

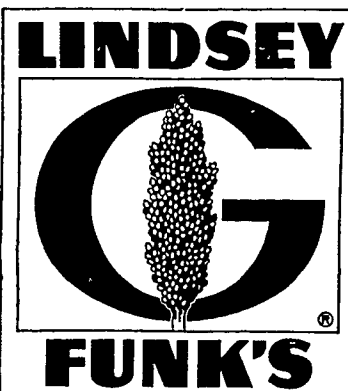

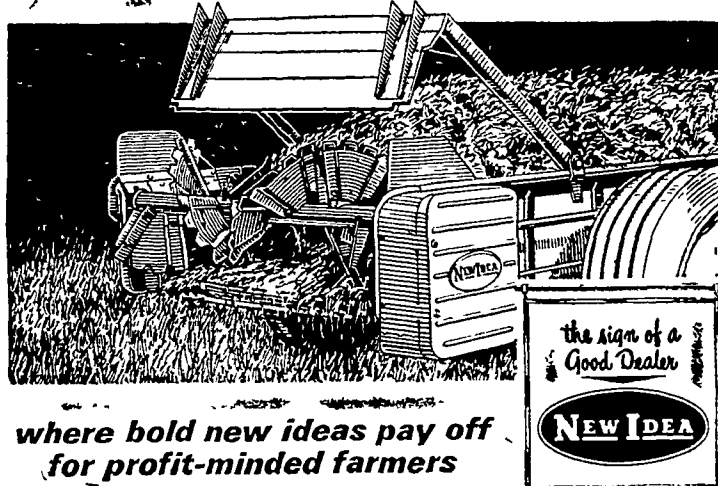
