The 47 Landrace brought a total of \$3,455. Auctioneer was Paul Z. Martin, Blue Ball.

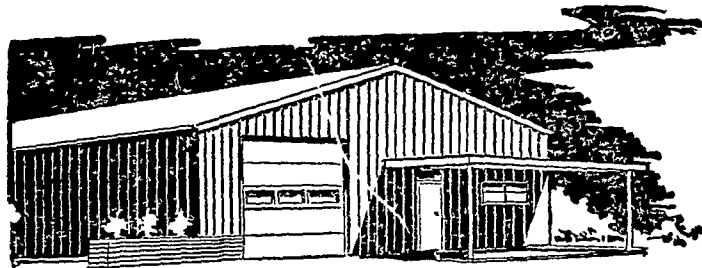

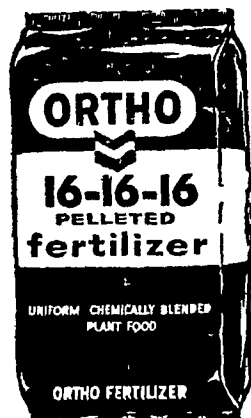
