Headquarters Of Agway, Inc. Is Syracuse

Agway, Inc., the farmer cooperative formed by the merger of Eastern States Farmers' Exchange and Grange League Federation (GLF), will be headquartered in Syracuse, N.Y., it was announced this week.

Executive appointments were announced by Executive Vice

President Edmund H. Fallon, and Senior Vice President William D. Milsop.

All the staff members are executives of Cooperatives GLF Exchange and Eastern States Farmers' Exchange, the two cooperatives that will merge into Agway on July 1. They continue in their GLF and ES positions until that time.

Board chairman James C. Corwith and president Jonathan Davis said the Agway

board unanimously favored Syracuse as headquarters location, after hearing results of a study made by a consulting firm.

Agway will provide purchasing and marketing services for farmers throughout the territory now served by GLF and Eastern States: New York, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, New England, Delaware, and parts of Maryland and Ohio.

Specifically cited in Syracuse's favor were its location in relation to Agway members and markets, and its excellent travel facilities, both surface and air. The study evaluated travel into prospective headquarters sites as well as travel from Agway head offices to facilities across the organization's territory.

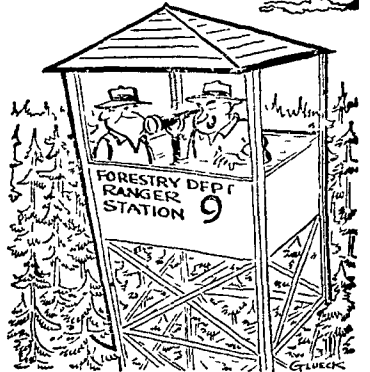
