

Weekly Broiler Report

State hatcherymen set 1,074,000 eggs for commercial broiler production during the week, down 5 percent from the previous week and 20 percent below a year ago according to the Pennsylvania Crop Reporting Service.

The 3-week total was 22 percent below a year earlier. Placements during the week were down 4 percent from a week earlier and remained the same as a year ago. The 10-week total was up 6 percent from a year ago.

Inshipments of broiler-type chicks for the past 10-weeks totaling 335,000 were 42 percent above a year ago. Outshipments of 1,431,000 were down 29 percent.

Number of eggs set in the 22 major producing states re-

remained the same as the previous week but were down 4 percent from a year earlier. Placements were up 1 percent from a week ago.

Angus Sale Apr. 18 At Abbottstown

The Pennsylvania Angus Association announces the first 1964 Grasstime Angus sale to be held at 1 p.m., Saturday, April 18 on the Adams County Fairgrounds at Abbottstown.

Four bulls and 64 heifers and cows, many with calves at foot will be sold. All come from prominent Angus herds in eastern and central Pennsylvania, among them Eisenhower Farms Gettysburg.

In addition to some six million home loans for veterans, the Veterans Administration has guaranteed or insured 72,000 farm loans and more than 238,000 business loans.

Delmarva Prices Gain; Demand Good

Live broiler prices in Delmarva advanced slightly during the 24 hour period ending 10 30 Friday morning.

At farm prices ranged 14 6 to 15 8 on reported purchases of 1,124,000 head including 540,100 head listed and sold at the Eastern Shore Poultry Growers Exchange Thursday. More than a third of the sales were at 15 to 15 4.

Live broiler demand was good for the moderate auction offerings. Ready to cook demand was spotty ranging barely fair to good on retail activity for next week.

With several plants operating today, estimated slaughter for the week end by Eastern Shore processors was 921,000 head compared to the 890,000 head last week end.

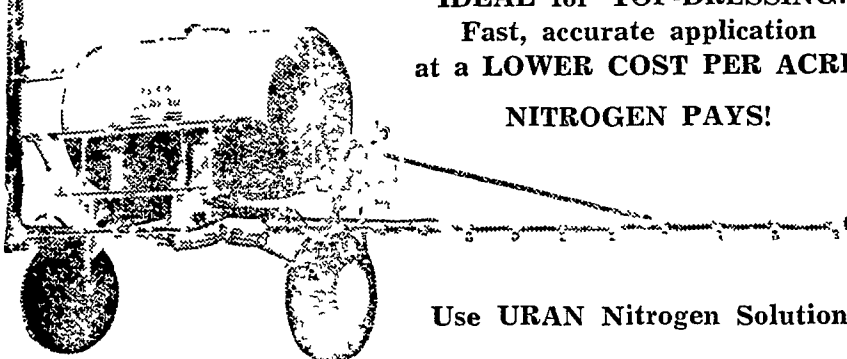

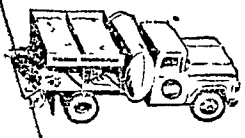

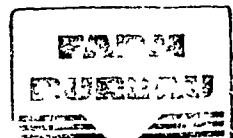
