

State To Furnish Cash Prizes For County Plowing Contests

Cash awards from the state for county winners in the plowing contest will be presented this year for the first time. It was announced Monday night at the meeting of the Lancaster County Soil Conservation District Directors.

All county winners will receive a \$25 cash award from the state committee, if there are at least two county contestants.

The state contest will be held July 29 on the farm of Daniel W. Rumler, Fort McCond, Franklin County, in conjunction with the Chambersburg 100th anniversary celebration of the Civil War.

Top state award in both level land and contour competition will be \$100. Second place will be \$25, third place \$15, and all state contestants will receive \$10.

In other business Steve Mace, Land Management specialist with the Pennsylvania Game Commission, reported that 1,500 pines and 1,900 spruce seedlings have been delivered to Lancaster County Soil Conservation District cooperating farmers. Game Commission cooperators planted another 4,850 pines, 2,100 spruce, 600 hemlock and 385 shrub seedlings. The seedlings were furnished free of charge from Game Commission nurseries for the purpose of wildlife habitat improvement.

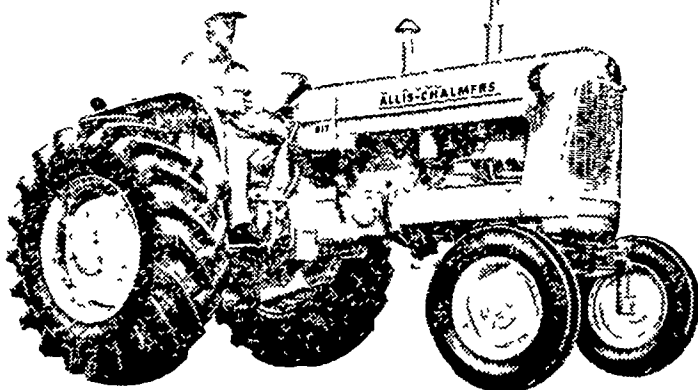

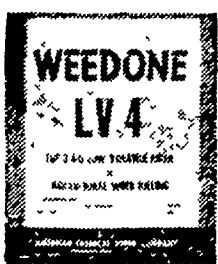
