Plow Matches To Display Old Machines

CHAMBERSBURG — Displays of farm machinery and equipment in use at different periods dating back to 1864 will highlight exhibits being assembled for the 1964 Pennsylvania Plowing Contest, July 29, on the Daniel W. Rumler farm, near Edenville, 7 miles west of Chambersburg.

Henry E. Warner, local arrangements chairman and also head of special events for a Chambersburg twin centennial, today said elaborate collections of tillage and harvesting apparatus are being planned.

Harvesting tools will range from the sickle, scythe and cradle to the mower, first breakthrough in farm mechanization, and on to the reaper, binder, combine, and forage harvesters.

Tillage equipment will include hand rakes and hoes, horse-drawn plows, harrows and cultivators, and on up to the tandem operated multiple-row rigs that are common today.

Warner, vice president of the plowing contest, said special educational features will include a tractor safety driving competition for 4-H and FFA youths. Soil and water conservation practices on the host farm and neighboring places will be added attractions.

The plowing championships, in which the state's top sodbusters will vie for the 1964 level land and contour titles, and related activities will comprise the Agricultural Day program in a centennial-bicentennial celebration being planned by the town of Chambersburg for July 23-Aug. 2.
