Fresh Holstein cows brought \$275-530, Guernseys \$150-200, and other breeds \$150-200. Stock heifers brought \$60-140

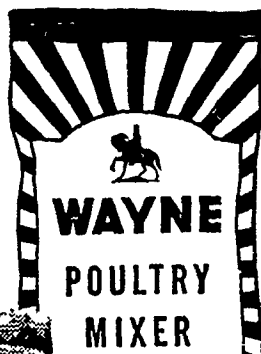

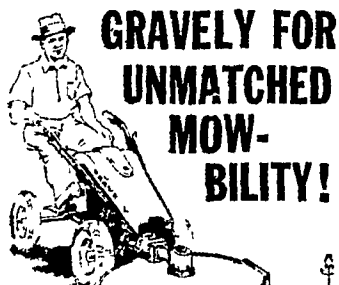
