

McCulloch Will Head Dairy Show

HARRISBURG — State Secretary of Agriculture Leland H. Bull today announced the appointment of Harold R. McCulloch, of State College, as manager of the new Pennsylvania All-American Dairy Show that makes its debut Sept. 14-17.

McCulloch will be serving in a similar capacity with the Pennsylvania Livestock Exposition to be held Nov. 9-13. He also is secretary of the Pennsylvania State Farm Show, and until his retirement in 1963 was assistant director of the Co-

operative Extension Service at the Pennsylvania State University.

Both the dairy and livestock shows are state sponsored. They are open international events, embracing the United States and Canada, and both will be held in the State Farm Show Building in Harrisburg.

Cuthbert Nairn, Douglassville, internationally-known breeder and judge of dairy cattle, will be general chairman of the dairy show.

Secretary Bull said judging schedules for the dairy show will be coordinated with those at the Syracuse, N. Y., State Fair and the Eastern States Exposition at West Springfield, Mass..
