**County Bull Is Silver Medal Sire Winner**

A Registered Holstein bull owned by John M. Umble and Earl L. Umble, both of Atglen, has qualified as a Silver Medal Type Sire under the new plan of daughter-dam comparisons based on type classification scores.

Swampy Hollow Pabst Leader (VG) received The Holstein-Friesian Association of Ameri-

ca award on the basis of 11 classified daughters with an average type score exceeding that of their dams.

The new method involves daughter-dam comparisons similar to those commonly employed in gauging a sire's ability to transmit production.

Under the plan, each cow's type score is converted to a percentage of the breed average for her age group. Comparisons are drawn between the resulting figures averaged for both dams and daughters.

Watch house plants carefully as approaching summer brings stronger sunlight. Horticulturists recommend moving plants that are doing poorly in the brighter sun to shady locations.





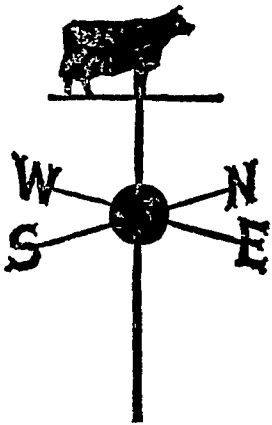
