

## Champion FFA Tractor Driver Is Solanco Future Farmer

James Esbenshade, a 16 year old Solanco High School junior, won the York-Lancaster Future Farmers of America safe tractor driving contest Saturday at New Holland High School.

moved up one place from the runner up spot last year to win a chance at the state championships next month at the Pennsylvania State University.

Esbenshade, a breeder of Ayshire cattle, has placed at or near the top of the Solanco Fair tractor driving contest for several years. His farming program on the 260 acre dairy and crop farm helped him win the chapter farmer degree at Solanco.

Following Esbenshade by 65 points in the area competition was Larry Shilde, Hanover R3.

Contest judges were Henry Givler, teacher of vocational agriculture at Pequea Valley High School and Larry Weaver, state FFA vice president from New Holland R1.

In third place was George Zimmerman, East Earl R1, a member of the Grassland Chapter, New Holland.

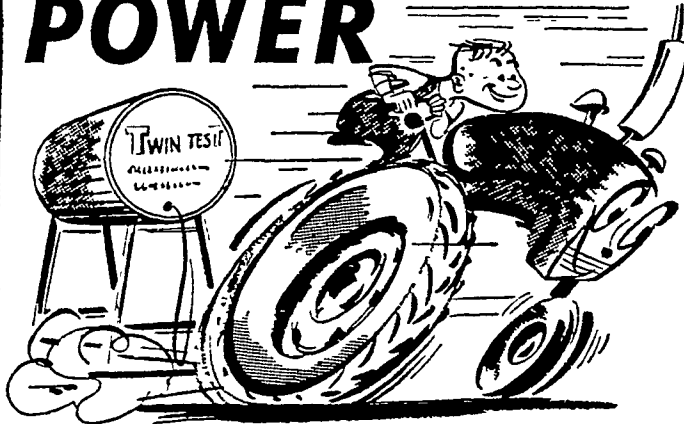
vania Bureau of Milk Sanitation.

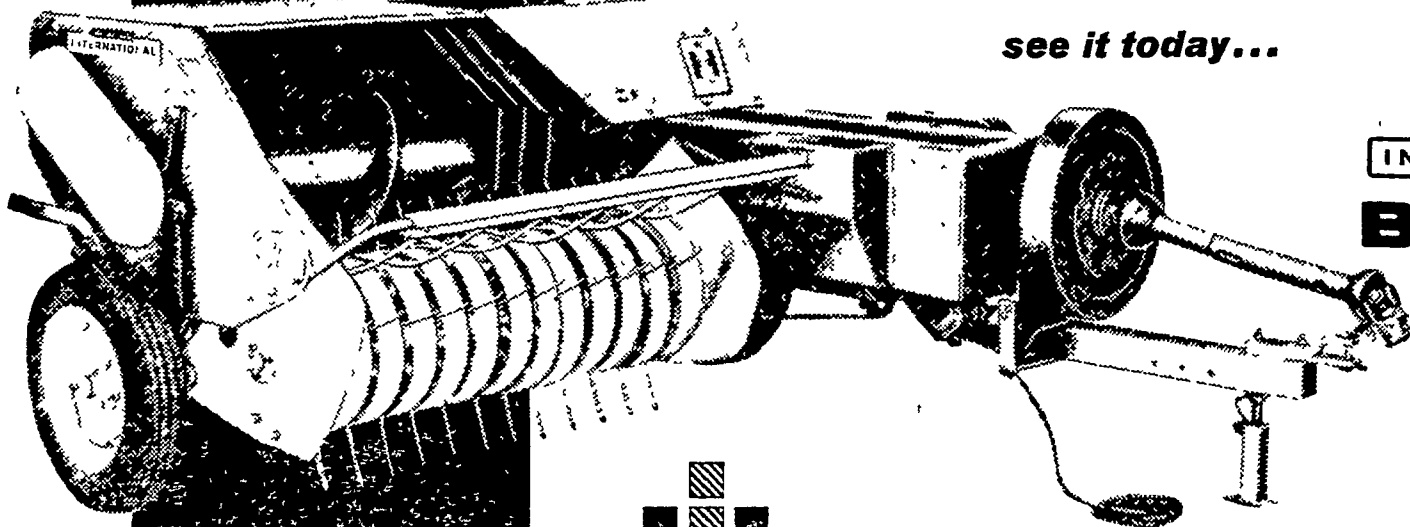
