Fresh Holstein cows brought \$250-510; Guernseys \$150-200, and other breeds \$150-200 Stock bulls were \$140-215, and stock heifers were \$65-150.

At the May 11 auction 217 horses sold at steady prices.

Riding horses brought \$135-420; driving horses were \$130-200, and killer horses brought 7-7½ cents a pound Pony mares were \$40-80, and geldings \$30-90.

The 421 hogs at the May 11 sale sold 50-75 higher Retail hogs to local butchers crossed the block at 17-18.50 while grades 1 to 3 went to the packers at 16-16 75 Heavyweight hogs brought 15-15.60 and some were 11-13 50.

The 110 head of calves met a steady market at the May 11 sale Choice and prime vealers were 33-38.50, good and low choice 29-33, standard 25

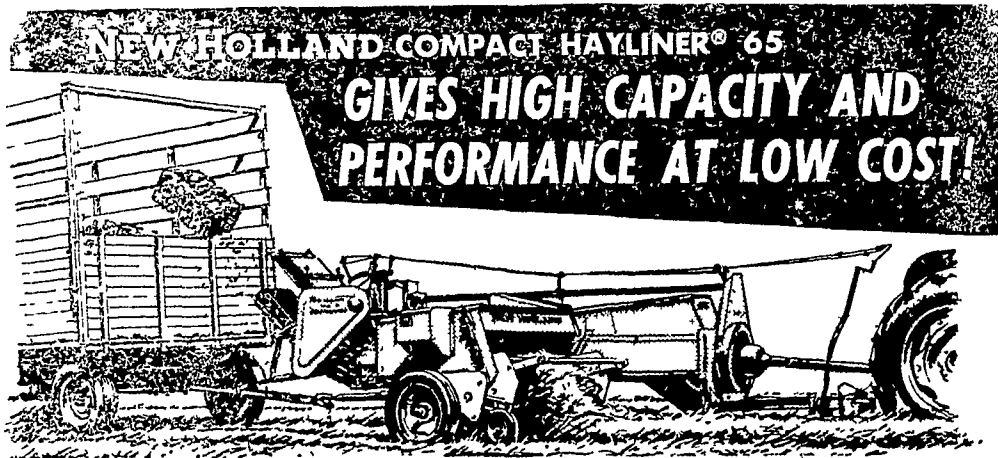
