

## Allied Mills Buys Land Tract For Expansion In Industrial Park

Allied Mills, Inc., of Chicago, manufacturers of Wayne livestock and poultry feeds, has purchased a 5½ acre tract in the new Lancaster-Hempfield Industrial Park.

Allied officials completed the purchase of the tract last week for \$18,140 and announced plans to construct a feed distribution center and warehouse employing about 25 persons.

Construction of the plant, estimated to cost in excess of a quarter million dollars, is expected to start in June.

Allied Mills has operated a Wayne Feeds district sales office at 11 N. Duke St. for approximately 15 years. Conley C. Bowers, district sales manager in charge of the office, and his staff will move to the new building when it is completed next fall.

The land negotiations were completed Thursday by Harrison H. Clement, attorney for Allied Mills, and Attorney H. Clay Burkholder, a director of the Industrial Development

Company of Lancaster County.

F. H. Blough, Chicago, Allied vice president in charge of production, said the new facility in Lancaster will "better enable the company to serve the expanding sales of Wayne Feeds for livestock, poultry, pets and laboratory animals in that section of Pennsylvania and northern Maryland."

Allied Mills operates 15 feed plants, two soybean extraction plants and three processing plants in the eastern section of the country. Eventually the Lancaster operation will be ex-

panded to include specialized facilities for processing and mixing feeds, the firm said.

At present the firm's operations include manufacturing plants at Everson, Pa. (near Pittsburgh) and Buffalo, N. Y.

The local facilities will include an office building and warehouse with nearly 20,000 square feet of floor space. Tanks will provide for storage of several hundred tons of bulk feed, and bagged feed will be in the warehouse area.

### In Center of Park

The Allied Mills tract is in the approximate center of the 134-acre industrial park and is midway between the Doner-ville and Centerville Roads. It will be served by Hempland Road, now under construction

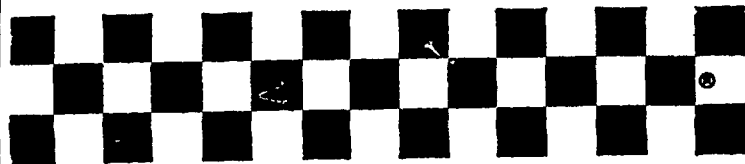

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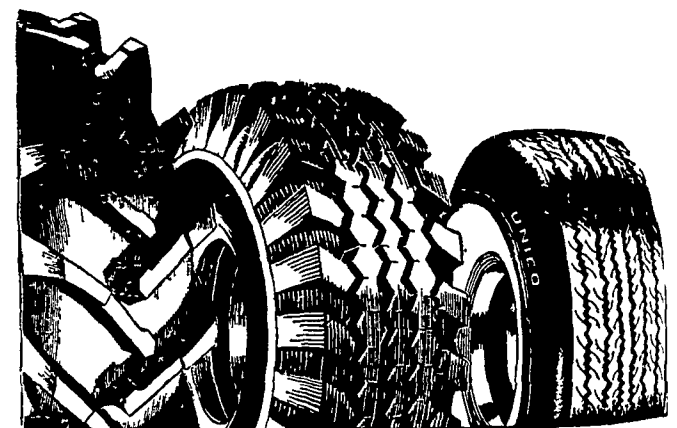
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
