GERANIUMS NEED LIGHT

Direct sunlight promotes the vigorous growth of geraniums and the plants will bloom continually, says Penn State extension floriculture specialists. Geraniums need several hours of direct sunlight every day. The plants grow well in south windows, but may be placed in east or west windows providing the sun will shine on them a few hours each day. In shade, geranuims develop long thin stems, small leaves, and few flowers.


