dean of agriculture at Purdue since 1957. Each year he lectures before some 100 groups and has visited each of the United States as well as many foreign countries.

Now in operation in the State of Washington is a new plant producing a frozen apple-juice concentrate, reports the U. S. Department of Agriculture. This is the first commercial use of a new apple-juice concentrating process Department research workers have developed. The plant furnishes a market for about 50,000 tons of apples a year and creates about 100 new jobs. The new product has a fresh fruit flavor, and like other frozen juice concentrates, you add water, stir, and it's ready to serve.

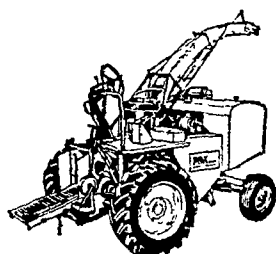

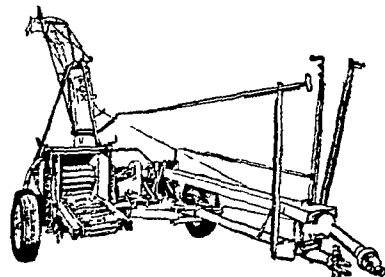

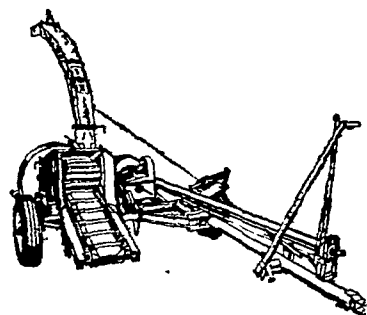
