State Plans Hog Cholera Eradication

HARRISBURG - An all-out effort to eradicate hog cholera in Pennsylvania was being planned today by the State Department of Agriculture jointly with a swine industry advisory committee

The committee, headed by Reno H. Thomas, of Beavertown, unanimously endorsed a proposal by the department to join in a national hog cholera program.

Thomas named a 13-member subcommittee to plan for coordination of the federal-state drive. On this committee are Dr. John C Shook, director, and Dr J Hubley Schall, of the State Bureau of Animal

Industry; Dwight E. Younkin, Dr. Samuel B. Guss, Dr. William A. Adams and Dr. H. W. Dunne, of the Pennsylvania Deadline Set State University.
