## State Plans Hog Cholera Eradication

HARRISBURG — An all-out effort to eradicate hog cholera in Pennsylvania was being planned today by the State Department of Agriculture jointly with a swine industry advisory committee.

The committee, headed by Reno H. Thomas, of Beavertown, unanimously endorsed a proposal by the department to join in a national hog cholera program.

Thomas named a 13-member subcommittee to plan for coordination of the federal-state drive. On this committee are Dr. John C. Shook, director, and Dr. J. Hubley Schall, of the State Bureau of Animal

Industry; Dwight E. Younkin, Dr. Samuel B. Guss, Dr. William A. Adams and Dr. H. W. Dunne, of the Pennsylvania State University.

Dr. Ralph W. Boone, veterinarian for the United States Department of Agriculture; Dr. Dean L. Snyder, Annville; Henry Gruber, Allentown, Joseph Gorski, Penns Park, Walter M. Dunlap, Jr., Lancaster; Dr. Robert C. Hammond, Lewisburg, and Thomas as chairman.

Agriculture Secretary Leland H. Bull told the committee "there is a need and opportunity for an expanded swine industry in Pennsylvania," and that economic production demands elimination of the cholera menace. He pledged the full backing of his department in administering the eradication program.

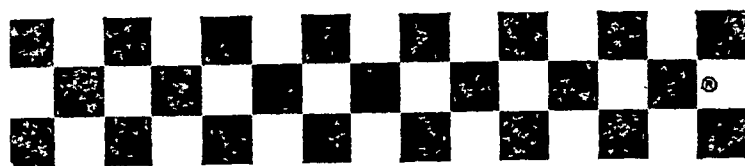
## Dairy Show Deadline Set

HARRISBURG — Six prominent dairy farmers and a dairy educationist today were named advisers to the new Pennsylvania All-American Dairy Show to be held Sept. 14-17 in the State Fair Show Building, Harrisburg.

Harold R. McCulloch, manager, said the advisory group will represent six dairy breeds and the Pennsylvania State University. Joe S. Taylor, head of dairy extension at the university, will be chairman.

Breed representatives are: Ayrshire, A. Reed Hayes, Reedsville, Brown Swiss, Rep. H. Francis Kennedy, Butler, RD 6, one of the sponsors of enabling legislation for the show in the State Legislature; Guernsey, William H. Juzi, Camp Hill, Holstein, William C. Nichol, State College, Jersey, Merle E. Miller, Carlisle, RD 3, Milking Shorthorn, Samuel I. Yoder, of Shoemaker'sville.

The show, a non-profit enterprise, will be sponsored by the State Department of Agriculture, Pennsylvania Fair Show Commission and the Pennsylvania Dairy and Allied Industries Association. Breeders in the United States and Canada will be eligible for \$45,000 cash premiums. Entries close Aug. 15.

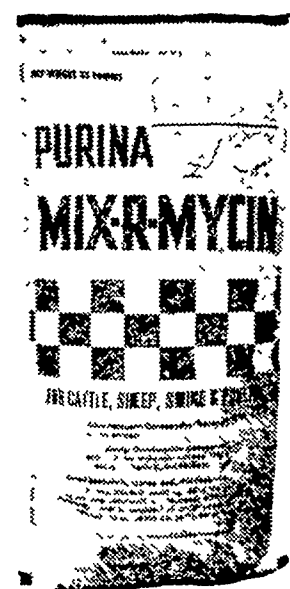
