

Ice Cream Is Most Popular Dairy Food

HARRISBURG — Ice cream, most popular frozen confection for Pennsylvanians, conforms in weight and quality to rigid standards fixed by state law, Secretary of Agriculture Leland H. Bull stated today.

These standards, he said, apply to all ice cream offered for sale in the commonwealth. Pennsylvania stands second only to California in ice cream production.

On a weight basis Pennsylvania ice cream standards top Federal requirements 4.75 pounds per gallon to 4.5 pounds. Pints must weigh a net of 9½ ounces and half-gallons, 38 ounces.

In Pennsylvania ice cream must contain at least 1.8 pounds of food solids per gallon. Secretary Bull said ice milk, which contains approximately 4 per cent fat, and artificially sweetened ice milk or ice cream are meeting a demand for dietary frozen desserts.

Artificially sweetened ice cream and ice milk may not contain any added sugar although sugar naturally present in fruits used for flavoring are permitted. These frozen products must be labeled with the nutrient composition and caloric content.

Custard sold in Pennsylvania must meet standards set for ice cream and must contain also at least 14 per cent egg yolk solids by weight. This is the equivalent of nearly 6 per cent whole eggs. In some states custard is a term ap-

We particularly urge all teenagers to include plenty of milk and milk products in their diets. Department of Agriculture noting that more than 16 million children now are able to enjoy milk and other nutritious foods.

Secretary Freeman said USDA "wholeheartedly and actively" endorses the June Dairy Month observance again this year, in recognition of the dairy industry's contribution to the health of the American people and to American agriculture.

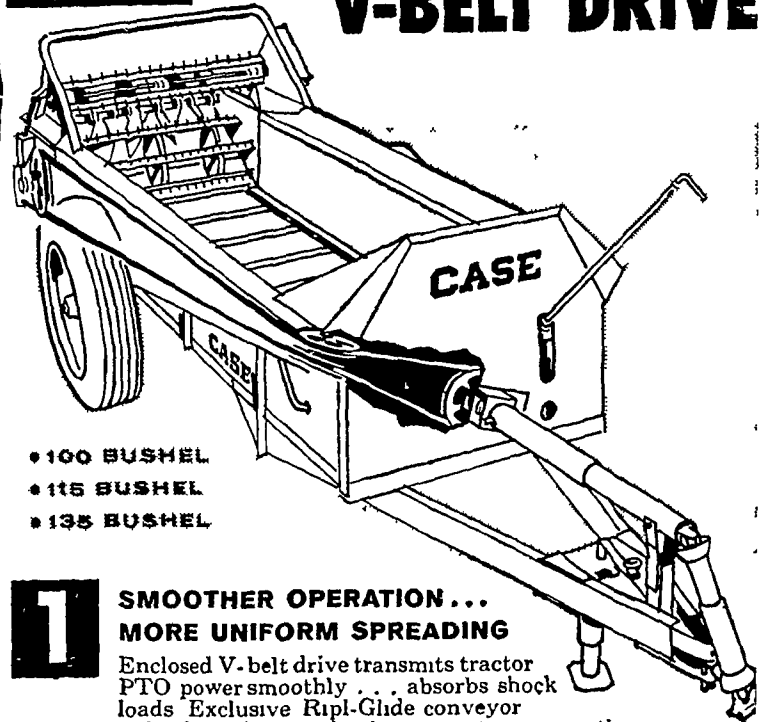

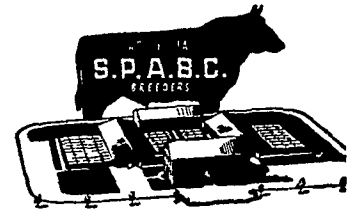
