Mrs. Doris Thomas, associate home economist of the Extension Service, entertained the group with pictures and a talk

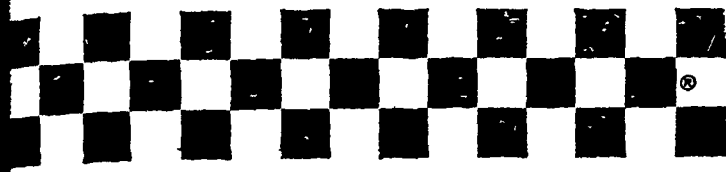

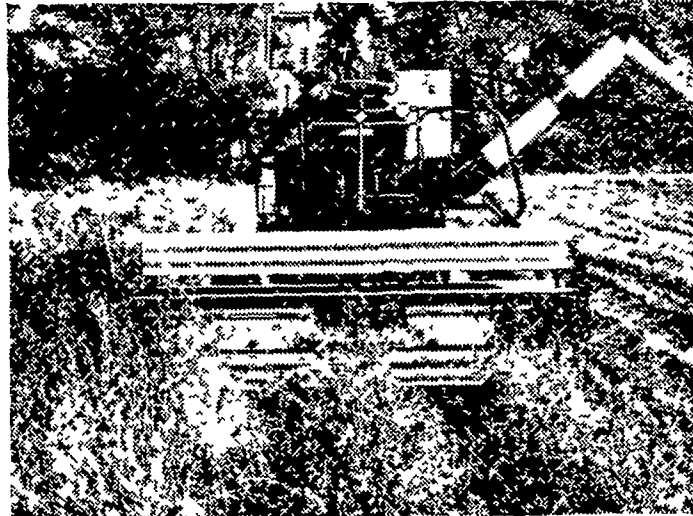
