brought \$125-550, and driving horses were \$125-215. Pony mares sold for \$40-120 and geldings made \$30-140. Killer horses were 7½ to 8 cents a pound.

The 385 market hogs sold 25 lower at the June 8 auction. Retail hogs to local butchers brought 17.50-18, grades 1 to 3 went to the packers at 16.85-17.50, and heavyweight hogs brought 15.50-16.75. Sows were 11-13.50. The 25 head of shoats brought \$9-11, 50 per head.

At the June 8 auction, 110 head of calves sold steady to 100 lower. Choice and prime vealers brought 30-34, good and low choice 26-30, standard 23-26, and cull and common 18-22.50.

The 30 lambs on sale, all weights, brought 20-25.
